## **Michael T Roberts**

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Michael T Roberts is a composer, guitarist, and teacher who specializes in writing music for voice: choral music, song, and theater.

Recent choral highlights include Mike's 2020-21 residency with International Orange Chorale of San Francisco, which included world premieres of 'Zoom' (for virtual choir) and 'Come to Us in Water.' In 2019, the Oakland Symphony Chorus commissioned the five-movement 'Mass for Freedom' for chorus and chamber orchestra, based on spirituals that became anthems of the Civil Rights movement. An avid educator, Mike has been commissioned multiple times by the Albany (CA) High School choirs and Sunset High School choirs in Portland, OR.

Born and raised in Connecticut, Mike earned his B.A. in Music from Dartmouth College, where he premiered his full-length opera, *Lotus Blooming in a Sea of Fire,* and toured the Northeast with his progressive soul band, Stand Up Eight. Following the band's move to the San Francisco Bay Area, Mike was commissioned by UC Berkeley to compose music for the play *Tooth and Nail* and a new adaptation of Isabel Allende's *Cuentos de Eva Luna*. The *Eva Luna* songs were a seed that sprouted into Mike's most recent project, a new ensemble featuring Persian-American singer Adrienne Shamszad that combines literature and poetry with new music rooted in World and American traditions.

Mike is a veteran performer on both classical and electric guitar. His compositions have been featured in *Soundboard*, the journal of the Guitar Foundation of America. With Duo Symphonious he released a recording of *The Portable Nutcracker*, an original two-guitar arrangement of Tchaikovsky's classic. In addition to two award-winning albums with Stand Up Eight, his electric guitar playing can be heard on the video game *Grand Theft Auto V*.

Mike holds a Master of Music degree in Composition from the San Francisco Conservatory, where he studied with David Garner and David Conte. He has taught guitar, bass, ukulele, and composition for over twenty years, both privately and in the classroom. He especially loves teaching children, and is an avid practitioner of the Orff-Schulwerk method and its principles of creative play.

Mike lives in Berkeley, CA with his wife, two kids, and approximately fortyseven instruments.
